Trail Project Detailed Description

New snowmobile trail created off of corridor 30 between intersections 118 and 119 in the Village of Dartford, County of Green Lake. Trail proceeds east, crosses Hwy 23 and continues east to travel around a registered drainage, returns west on previous railroad bed to where it can turn south and cross Hwy 23 and pass the local grocery store gas station which is on a spur to remain unfunded. It continues predominantly west into the City of Green Lake and connects with corridor trail. A second unfunded will continue to be maintained to Tuscumbia Golf Course and the Heidel House Restaurant and Conference Center. Arrangements have been made for Heidel House to be a trailer parking area and access to Big Green Lake which opens passage to more businesses and a second hotel.

GL City trail has been added to gain access to several crucial businesses which include a repair shop, gas station, grocery store, discount store, and four restaurants. This trail connects to Corridor 30 and has been created to become permanently established as a future alternative to the current trail on north side of Green lake which is being slowly developed along State Highway 23. This trail gives snowmobilers access to the Heidel House restaurant, hotel, and conference center. City and county officials, tourism reps and local business owners have partnered with the creation of this trail giving agreements to retain it permanently.

This trail gives snowmobilers access to the Wisconsin famous Heidel House restaurant, hotel, and conference center. City and county officials, tourism reps and local business owners have partnered with the creation of this trail giving agreements to retain it permanently. Requested is 5mi of funded trail.




