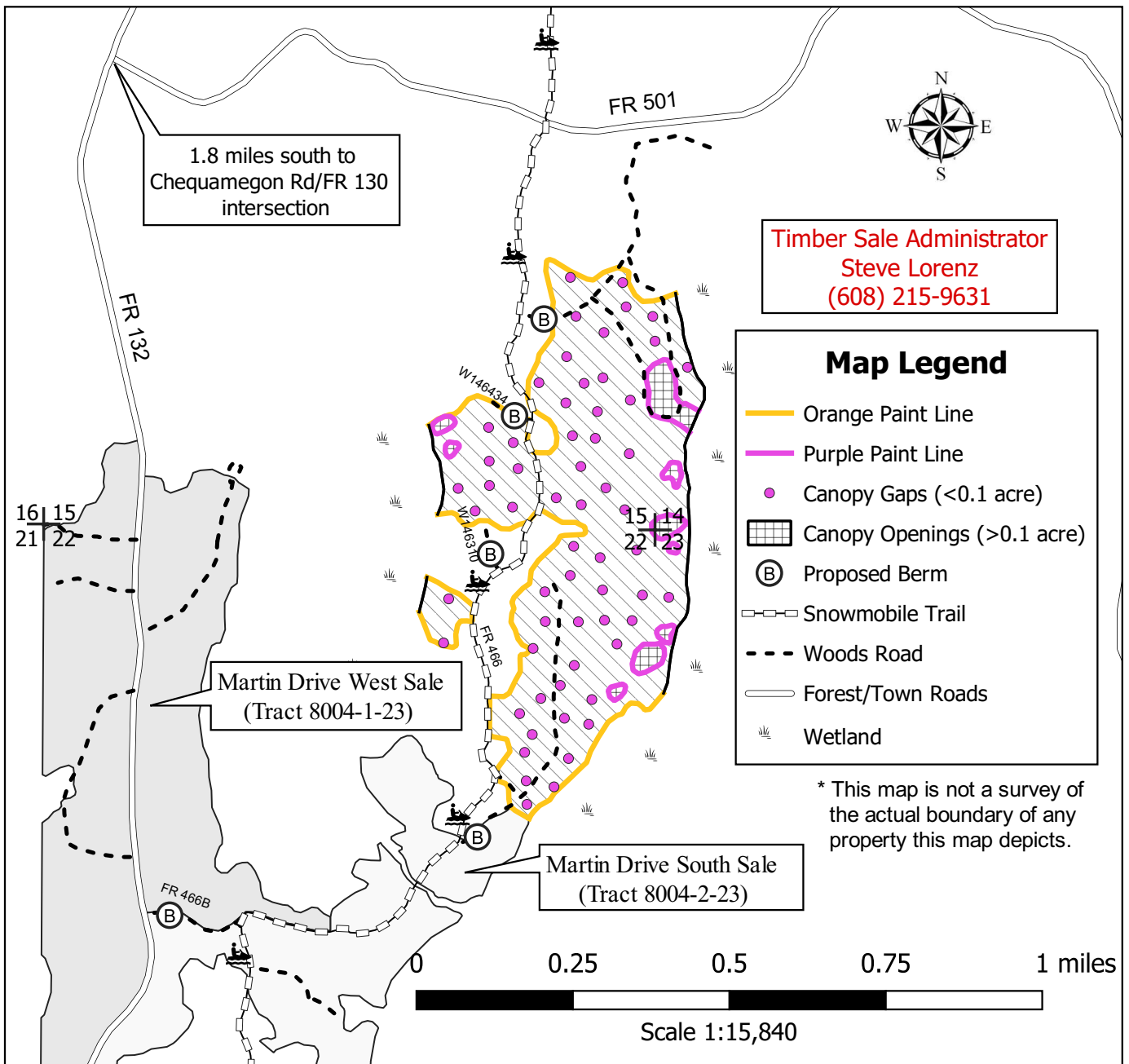

 Section 14, 15, 22, 23; T37N R3E; Price County, WI (Town of Emery)

Hardwood Selection Area (129 acres)

Area bounded by orange paint and natural swamp/bog edge.
 Harvest: 1) blue marked trees, and 2) aspen and ironwood containing 1 or more 100" sticks.

Canopy Gaps and Openings (13 acres)

Area bounded by purple paint (V-shaped marks face into gaps/openings; dots face outside).
 Harvest all trees greater than 1" d.b.h. except: 1) conifers, 2) yellow birch, 3) butternut,
 4) oak saplings less than 5" d.b.h., and 5) purple marked trees.

¹Mixed Hardwood Pulp includes 45% ash, 40% hard maple and 15% red maple (with small amounts of ironwood and other species).

²Mixed Hardwood Saw includes 6 MBF hard maple and 6 MBF red maple (with small amounts of other species).

Other species not mentioned will be charged at the Mixed Hardwood Pulp or Saw price, accordingly.

- 1) Bids must meet or exceed the total minimum acceptable bid of **\$31,280.00**.
- 2) Each species/product must be bid on (per ton or MBF).
- 3) A bid will be rejected if any individual species/product bid is \$0.
- 4) Cordwood weight conversion factors are as follows:
Mixed Hardwood = 2.400 Aspen = 2.250 Basswood = 1.925 Ash = 2.300

Paint Color Scheme:

- **Blue:** Trees to be harvested. **Cut all blue marked trees.**
- **Orange:** Stand boundary and reserve/leave trees. **Do not cut any orange marked trees.**
- **Purple:** Canopy gap boundary and reserve/leave trees. **Do not cut any purple marked trees.**

Seasonal Restrictions:

- Harvesting operations are limited to **frozen ground conditions only.**
- Hauling on snowmobile trail is prohibited on Christmas and New Year's holidays (from noon on December 23rd to 4 a.m. January 2nd), and all other weekends (from noon Friday to 4 a.m. Monday) when trails are open.

Harvest Requirements:

- Contract ending date will be **June 30, 2026** (allowing 3 winter seasons to complete).
- Harvest boundaries include orange paint line and natural swamp/bog edge.
- No machine operation allowed outside of orange boundary paint line or in adjacent swamp/bog areas.
- No bond is required with bid on this timber sale. A performance bond of 15% of the total bid value will be required within 6 weeks of announcement of successful bidder.
- Sale will be mill scale using a 30-day billing period.

- Equipment must be cleaned and inspected by DNR staff before entering and leaving the sale area to prevent the introduction/spread of invasive species.

Slash Requirements:

- Slash height within 100 feet of snowmobile trail shall be less than 36” in height.
- Do not pile slash within riparian or other wetland areas.

Road/Trail Requirements:

- Keep snowmobile trail free and clear of logging debris. Maintain at least 4” of compacted snow (conditions permitting) on trail surface when open to public use.
- Forwarding is allowed on snowmobile trail; however, no skidding is allowed on snowmobile trail except at designated crossings with the discretion of the sale administrator.
- DOT approved signage is required to be placed on FR 132, FR 501 and along the snowmobile trail during harvest and hauling operations for safety reasons.

Additional Requirements:

- NO SALE MAY BEGIN WITHOUT PRIOR NOTIFICATION AND AN ON-SITE MEETING WITH A WISCONSIN DNR SALE ADMINISTRATOR.
- Keep all logging debris and machine operations within sale boundaries.
- Leave all standing snag and cull/den trees that do not pose a safety hazard. If needed to remove as a safety precaution, cut and leave lay on the ground.
- New temporary roads, stubs, or turn-arounds will need approval by the timber sale administrator and may require berms/slash.
- Temporary Roads shall have the road base constructed to a width of 12 feet or narrower, and with vegetative clearing of trees and brush not to exceed a width of 25 feet. Exceptions to the 12-foot maximum width of the road base may be granted by the sale administrator for operational reasons.
- If roads that are marked with **Proposed Berm** symbol are utilized, they must be closed with a logging debris berm. Do not dig a depression that will collect and hold water when constructing berms.
 - **Proposed Berm** shall be constructed using logging debris which includes any combination of dirt mixed with rocks, stumps, logs, root-wads, and/or slash.
 - **Proposed Berm** shall be constructed without creating a defined trench.
 - **Proposed Berm** shall be at least 4-5 feet in height from ground level.
- All road maintenance and post-harvest rehabilitation will be the purchaser’s responsibility. A sample contract including road maintenance specifications can be obtained upon request.
