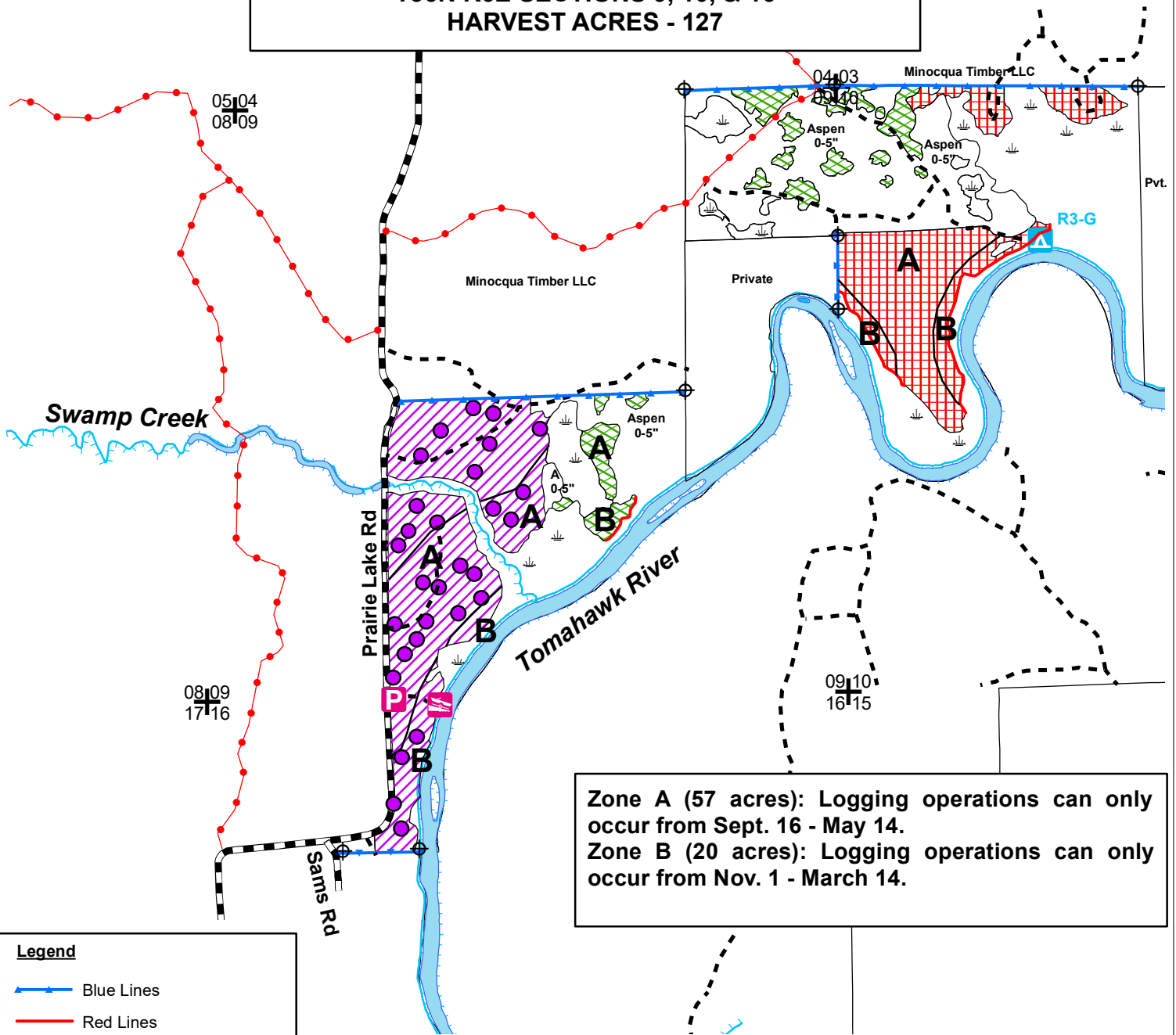


**WISCONSIN

**Zone A (57 acres): Logging operations can only occur from Sept. 16 - May 14.**  
**Zone B (20 acres): Logging operations can only occur from Nov. 1 - March 14.**

- Red Pine Area (68 acres): Cut all red maple, jack pine, and orange marked trees. Cut all 1-5" red maple concurrently.
- Purple Painted Gaps: Cut all trees within the gaps including the purple painted boundary trees. Also cut all 1-5" trees except for white/red pines.
- Aspen Area (42 acres): Cut all aspen, white birch, balsam fir, jack pine, and red maple. Cut all 1-5" aspen & maple.
- Jack Pine Area (17 acres): Cut all trees except for red pine, white pine, spruce, and oak. Cut all 1-5" aspen & maple.

**Note: Do NOT cut any green marked trees in any of the above areas. Logging operations to occur during daylight working hours only.**

This sale is located within the Willow Forest Production Area, Tomahawk River Pines Native Community Area, and the River Scenic Management Area.

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to a 4” top diameter will be cut and utilized.

<sup>1</sup> Approximately 85% red pine, 15% white pine. Includes 296 MBF red pine and 38 MBF white pine sawtimber. (Wt. conv. 2.226 tons/cd)

<sup>2</sup> Approximately 96% jack pine, 4% balsam fir (Wt. conv. 2.125 tons/cd)

<sup>3</sup> Approximately 52% red maple, 27% white birch, 19% oak and 2% cherry. Includes 10 MBF red maple, 1 MBF white birch, 1 MBF oak. (Wt. conv. 2.387 tons/cd)

Note: Total sale volume equates to 41 tons/acre or 18.4 cords/acre.

Special Conditions:

1. All pine products cut between April 1 and September 1 must be removed from the sale area within three weeks from time of cutting. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to April 1 of each year.
2. Cutting must be concurrent for all species. Do not damage residual trees.
3. Do not cut, knock down or utilize any dead trees, except they may be cut down along roadways where they pose a safety hazard.
4. Slash within 50 feet of all roads, trails, and waterbodies must be lopped and/or scattered to lie within two feet of the ground and be pulled back 10’ behind the tree line concurrently with cutting. No slash allowed across any blue/red lines, or within any wetland or waterbody.
5. Whole tree utilization or biomass harvesting is not allowed.
6. Follow WI BMP’s for water quality at all times. Avoid wetlands as much as possible and only operate within them during very dry times with timber matting or under frozen ground conditions. No equipment is allowed within 15 feet of waterbodies and no trees are to be cut within 15 feet of the river or creek.
7. The Snowmobile Trail must be kept free of debris, snow covered in winter, and left in good condition for vehicle traffic at all times.
8. Landings and any new logging roads generally must be 200’ or greater from the Tomahawk River. Roads and landings must be approved by the Willow Flowage Property Manager in advance.
9. Logging operations in Zone A(approx. 57 acres) will only be allowed from September 16 to May 14. Logging operations in Zone B(approx. 20 acres) will only be allowed from November 1 to March 14. Logging operations must occur during daylight hours for safety and noise concerns with campers and other recreation users. Use extra caution when cutting near the group campsite R3-G and notify the Willow Flowage Property Manager in advance of cutting near this area.
10. Legal access into the northeast block of the timber sale is via the snowmobile trail and Wood Road about half a mile to the north.
