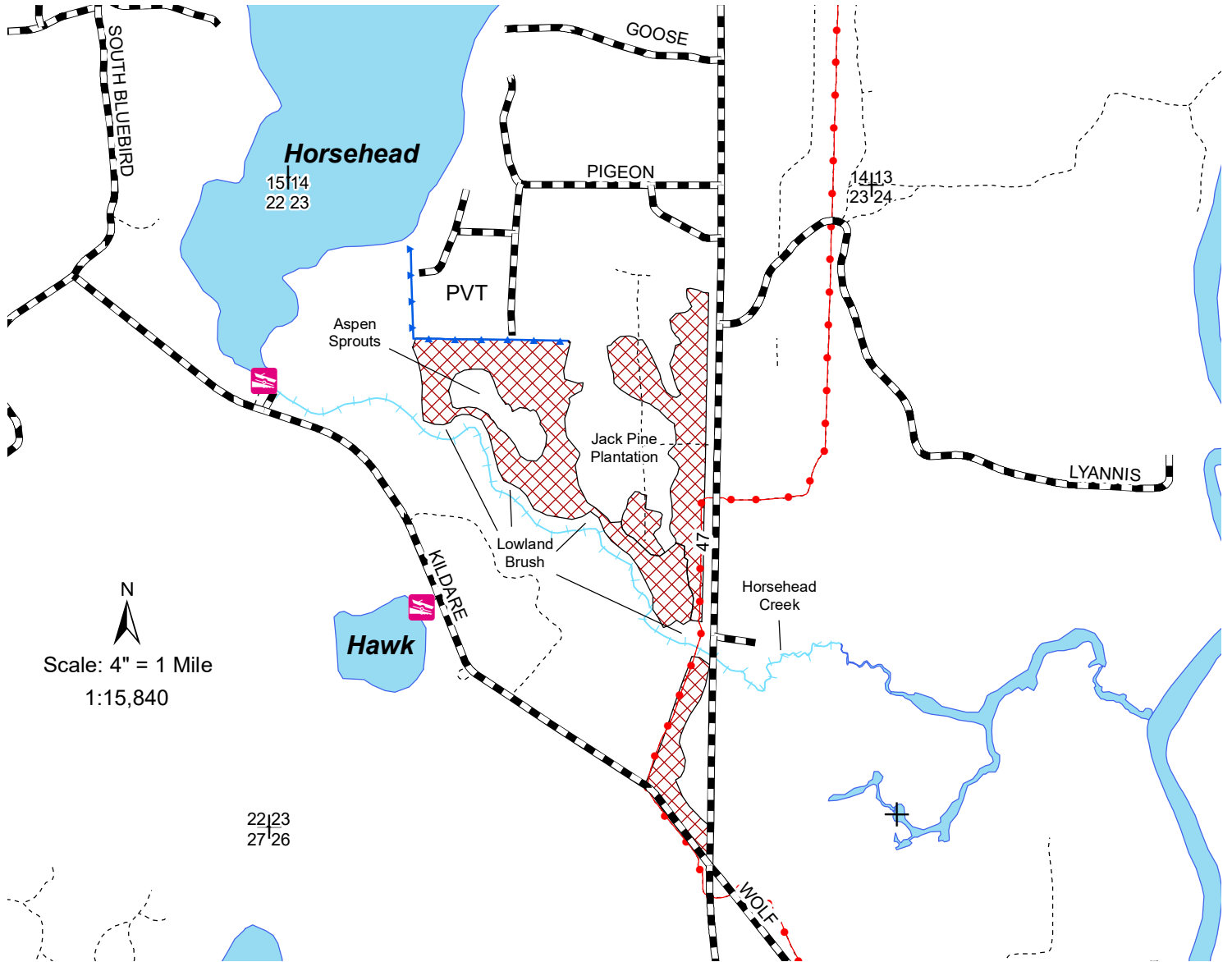

All trees that will yield one or more 100-inch sticks to a 4" top diameter will be cut and utilized within the designated timber sale boundary.

Whole tree utilization is NOT allowed.

¹Approximately 95% red pine and 5% white pine. Included is an estimated 315 MBF of potential sawlogs
The total sale contains approximately 40 tons/acre or 17 cords/acre.

Special Conditions:

1. Harvesting will be allowed between October 1st – March 31st.
2. All pine products remaining on the landing after April 1st must be removed from the sale area within three weeks.
3. Minimize damage to any of the residual trees or seedling/saplings.
4. No harvesting of unmarked pine, oak, and spruce, plus retaining wildlife trees, such as trees with cavities or loose, sloughing bark, and snags, dead trees, broken off limbs, or hazard trees that are not marked unless they pose an immediate safety hazard.
5. Slash must be lopped and/or scattered to lie within two feet of the ground and pulled back at least ten feet behind the tree line concurrent with cutting. No tops or slash allowed across any red line, blue line, wetland, or within the DOT row.
6. Follow WI BMPs for water quality at all times.
7. Additional roads and landings must be approved by the timber sale administrator (or designee) in advance of use.
8. All existing woods roads must be left in good condition and be restored to pre-harvest condition upon sale completion.
9. The snowmobile trail must be restored to the original presale condition after the harvest.
10. Trails will remain open and always kept free of hazards during the timber harvest. When the harvest is occurring, proper "Logging Ahead" signs will be placed on all the trails that the snowmobiles use for the public's safety.
11. All slash to be pulled back 25' from snowmobile trail. Lopping of slash to within 2 feet of the ground.
12. If the contract is to be worked on during multiple time periods a mid-contract "pull-off inspection meeting will be required. One-week notice shall be given by the contractor prior to moving equipment off-site. During the "pull-off" inspection provisions needing attention will be documented. The contractor at this time can decide to remedy them before pulling off or rectify them when moving back onto the site. If the latter is chosen documented items shall be addressed before harvesting
