PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO REISSUE A WISCONSIN POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (WPDES) PERMIT No.WI-0028100-10-0

Permittee: Village of Shiocton, PO BOX 26, Shiocton, WI, 54170-0026

Facility Where Discharge Occurs: Shiocton Wastewater Treatment Facility, W7844 West Street, Shiocton, Wisconsin

Receiving Water And Location: Wolf River in Outagamie County

Brief Facility Description and Summary of Proposed Changes: The Village of Shiocton owns and operates a secondary treatment activated sludge wastewater treatment facility. The facility was constructed in 1980, with additional upgrades in 1995. The plant's annual average design flow is 0.151 million gallons per (MGD), and existing flows are approximately 0.104MGD. Treatment consists of a raw sewage wet well, three submersible pumps, comminutor/grinder, backup bar screen, circular primary clarifier, dual secondary-activated sludge aeration basins, and a final clarifier. Treated effluent is seasonally disinfected with gaseous chlorine and ultimately dechlorinated using sodium bisulfite. Waste sludge is treated aerobically and dewatered by screw press and two drying beds. Resultant cake sludge is stored on-site prior to land application on DNR approved sites. Treated effluent is discharged on a continuous basis via Outfall 001 through 900 feet of pipe to the east bank of the Wolf River, approximately 0.5 miles south of Highway 54 near Old Highway 54.

The Department has tentatively decided that the above-specified WPDES permit should be reissued.

Limitations and conditions which the Department believes adequately protect the receiving water are included in the proposed permit. Land application of waste shall be done in accordance with permit conditions and applicable codes. All land application sites shall be approved prior to their use. To receive a list of approved sites, or to be notified of potential approvals, contact the above-named basin engineer.

Persons wishing to comment on or object to the proposed permit action, or to request a public hearing, may write to the Department of Natural Resources at the above-named permit drafter's address. All comments or suggestions received no later than 30 days after the publication date of this public notice will be considered along with other information on file in making a final decision regarding the permit. Anyone providing comments in response to this public notice will receive a notification of the Department's final decision when the permit is issued. Where designated as a reviewable surface water discharge permit, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is allowed up to 90 days to submit comments or objections regarding this permit determination. If no comments are received on the proposed permit from anyone, including U.S. EPA, the permit will be issued as proposed.

The Department may schedule a public informational hearing if requested by any person and shall schedule a public informational hearing if a petition requesting a hearing is received from 5 or more persons or if response to this notice indicates significant public interest pursuant to s. 283.49, Wis. Stats. Requests for a public informational hearing shall state the following: the name and address of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the interest in the proposed permit of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the reasons for the request; and the issues proposed to be considered at the hearing.

Information on file for this permit action, including the draft permit, fact sheet and permit application, may be inspected and copied at either the above-named permit drafter's office or the above named basin engineer's office, Monday through Friday (except holidays), between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Please call the permit drafter or basin engineer for directions to their office location, if necessary. Information on this permit action may also be obtained by calling the permit drafter at (608) 419-4155 or by writing to the Department. Reasonable costs (15 cents per page for copies and 7 cents per page for scanning) will be charged for information in the file other than the public notice, permit and fact sheet.
